Last month's guest speaker was Con Fire's Deputy Fire Marshal, Steve Aubert . Starting his career at age 19 after graduating from Sequoia High School in Redwood City, CA. (also the Alma Mater of our Big Sir, Jim Wangeman), Steve rose up through the ranks to become the last Fire Chief at Oni-



uka Air Force Station in Sunnyvale, CA. (Part of the Navy's closed Moffett Field which fielded the Blimps and their Hangars). Now out of a job, he made a career move to Con Fire in 2009 where he was assigned to help East County Fire with their fire investigations. In 2019, Steve was selected out of a field of 16 candidates to be named as the first Fire Inspector in the history of Con Fire. This new position was deemed necessary after the 2016 "Ghostship Warehouse Fire" in Oakland.





Golf News, Johnny Welton

The chill is in the air. The fire feels good. Holidays are upon us and golf is off the schedule for a couple of months. But that doesn't mean that SIR Golf isn't busy. End of the Year Surveys are about to be emailed. NCGA dues are due. Soon we will be making reservations for all those events on the 2025 Schedule!



Last meeting we celebrated another great year. Ten well attended and quickly played rounds of golf. Randy Zierau won the Individual Championship for the second year in a row but picked up the "Sandbagger" award for the first time. Forty (90.9%) of the players this year won something. \$1,972 was awarded. Each year, golfers retire from the game, but our golf group continues to grow. 16 new players tried our group for the first time and two have already signed up for next year. The core of the group is 20 that played seven or more times. We averaged 23.5 players at each event, which is the most ever to play.

In golf, the objective is to score the lowest number of strokes possible. In stroke play, you count all your shots for each hole, and the player with the lowest score at the end of the round wins. In match play, you compete against another player, and the winner is determined by who wins the most holes.

A handicap is a measure of a player's skill level, and it's used to level the playing field when playing against more skilled players.

The earliest record of the golf handicap being created dates way back to the 17th century (although the word handicap was not used at the start). During the 19th century, a three-score method for calculating a golf handicap was created in England and Scotland.

To get your number, you used to take the difference of the average of your three best scores during the year. That number represented your official handicap.

In the United States, the USGA introduced its world handicap system in 1911. It was based on the three-round average that started in England. They also developed a par rating system that assessed the average score of a scratch golfer on every course. This allowed golfers who played at different courses to understand their handicap relative to one another.

By the 21st century, there were six different handicap systems recognized throughout the world. Most of these systems shared common features, but there were some significant differences that also made them non-universal.

Golf is a game that requires both skill and etiquette. Following the rules of golf and practicing proper etiquette is essential to ensure that everyone enjoys the game. The rules of golf are set by the USGA and are designed to maintain the integrity and fairness of the game. We like to be competitive but to fairly compete, we need a handicap system. More importantly, we need everyone to use the handicap system in the same way and with the same attention to the rules. If there is not the same commitment to the rules and posting scores, a handicap system cannot create fair competition.

Remember to always be respectful of other players and the course, and you'll be on your way to having a great day at the golf course!


Bowling news, Ron Wilson

On October 28th, during our weekly league session, Keith Jones Bowled a perfect "300" game. This, itself is an impressive achievement in the world of Senior Bowlers. What makes this especially impressive is it being Keith's 14th career perfect "300" game. Congratulations Keith on your fine achievement.

By doing the math for our summer and winter leagues over a 20 year period, approximately 138,000 games were bowled and our league produced only 7 or 8 perfect games.

For those of you who want to bowl SIR tournaments at other branches I will continue to do all of the paperwork to make it easy for you. All you have to do is write the check and show up.

As we close our 2024 bowling year I want to thank all of you who support our League and our tournaments. This past year has seen an increase in our league and tournament bowlers. I am hopeful we can continue this improvement in 2025.

Membership Requirements & Principles *(revised 2019)*

Membership is open to men, regardless of age, race, color, or religion. Member volunteers and staff administer and govern all branch activities. Nominal membership dues help provide for these activities. SIR supports no outside cause or interest. We prohibit discussions of politics and religion or the selling of anything to any member. Prospective members must be sponsored by an active member.

Attendance Policy (Revised July, 2012)

Luncheon meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Discovery Bay Country Club, 1475 Club House Drive. (There are exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion. If you cannot attend, you are required to notify the Attendance Chairman by the Friday prior to the luncheon meeting or you may be charged for the luncheon.

Regular members missing three consecutive meetings without notifying the Attendance Chairman, or missing more than five (5) meetings within the last 12 months for any reason (not counting May and December), will have their membership reviewed by the Branch Executive Committee (BEC), and may receive a notice from the BEC of their decision to consider terminating the absent Sir's membership.

Certification of attendance at another branch will be considered a credit to attendance.


