
Bowling news, Ron Wilson

A reminder for those "SIR and Guests" league bowlers who have not paid their last two weeks league fees; Our rules state that the last two weeks are due by week 30. Week 30 is March 31st, but we have extended this deadline to Monday April 7th. Please be sure you have paid by this date so our Secretary/Treasurer can begin season prize fund wrap up.

Our winter league will finish with our Sweeper Round on Monday May 19th. We will take the following Monday May 26th off due to Memorial Day. We will begin our summer 13 week league on Monday June 2nd and finish on Monday August 25th.

Please let me know as soon as you can if you will be bowling with us this summer. If you are going to bowl, please give me your team lineups or let me know if you want me to put you on a team.

Beginning with our summer league there will be a fee increase. Bowlero is raising our lineage per week to \$13.25 from the \$12.75 we are now paying. This increase will cause our total weekly fee to increase from our current \$18.00 per week to \$18.50 per week, unless the league chooses to make an adjustment to the prize fund portion of our fee. We can finalize this at the league meeting on the morning we begin summer league.

You walk up to the ball, clear your head, keep tempo, and swing away! There it goes!! If you can see it, follow it, and find it, you may have hit the best shot of your life ... or not. Do you try to hold onto the feeling so muscle memory can help you do it again or go back to the driving range and start over?

Keep reading all those tips in the magazines. Watch every lesson on video. Take from them what seems to best match your needs. Don't be overwhelmed by every new idea ... most aren't new anyway. It all must fit you! Words need to have meaning to you and fit your way of thinking about movement. Golf is one of the most technical sports and has more specific skills to master than any sport. It seems that all of that has been mentioned plays a part but it still comes down to what is going on in your head right at the time the club hits the ball that matters most. Oh, and what you do on your next swing!

Membership Requirements & Principles

(revised 2019)

Membership is open to men, regardless of age, race, color, or religion. Member volunteers and staff administer and govern all branch activities. Nominal membership dues help provide for these activities. SIR supports no outside cause or interest. We prohibit discussions of politics and religion or the selling of anything to any member. Prospective members must be sponsored by an active member.

Attendance Policy

Luncheon meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Discovery Bay Country Club, 1475 Club House Drive. (There are exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion. If you cannot attend, you are required to notify the Attendance Chairman by two Sundays prior to the luncheon meeting or you may be charged for the luncheon.

Regular members missing three consecutive meetings without notifying the Attendance Chairman, or missing more than five (5) meetings within the last 12 months for any reason (not counting May and December), will have their membership reviewed by the Branch Executive Committee (BEC), and may receive a notice from the BEC of their decision to consider terminating the absent Sir's membership.

Certification of attendance at another branch will be considered a credit to attendance.
